
Chapter Continues to Excel in Scholarship

FINISHES FIRST AMONG WABASH FRATERNITIES FOR GPA

As the past semester brought a return to normal and a return to the ordinary college experience, a return to the challenges of a fully in-person curriculum were welcome.

While the undergraduate brothers at times felt the challenges of a Wabash education, the chapter still managed to finish the Fall 2021 Semester with an average GPA of 3.355, roughly 0.2 GPA points greater than the all fraternity average of 3.164; good enough for first once again amongst Wabash's 10 fraternities.

The undergraduate chapter managed to excel in all academic areas of Wabash; from the hard sciences of Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Math to Political Science, History, and more. For this reason, FIJIs continue to be recognized by faculty, administration, and fellow students as symbol for academic success and should continue to for the foreseeable future.

PRESTIGIOUS INDIANAPOLIS PROGRAM TO BE HIGHLY REPRESENTED BY WABASH FIJIS

This Fall, many Wabash men like students before them had the chance to apply for admittance to the Orr Fellowship, a prestigious program based out of Indianapolis run around Indianapolis-based start-ups. The program partners each Fellow with a company for two years allowing them to experience challenging work for start-ups they likely wouldn't experience this early in their careers. In addition to valuable experience, the program offers Fellows robust mentorship and alumni networks.

Wabash is usually no stranger to sending graduates into the program. Each graduating class typically sends roughly 2-4 individuals into the program each year, an already impressive figure given the program excepts around 100 individuals nationally. This year, Psi Chapter was able to be represented by 5 finalists with 4 of them being offered fellowship. From left to right, Luke Bender, Solomon Davis, Graham Gnagy, Gerard Seig, and Will Yank (not pictured) all were able to reach finalist status, a round of interviews with host companies to determine potential fit. Luke Bender, Solomon Davis, Gerard Seig, and Will Yank all received offers although Will Yank ultimately ended up turning down a position in the Orr Fellowship.

Luke Bender, a Financial Economics major with a triple minor in Religion, Biology, and Business, was placed with Remodel Health and will officially serve as an engagement coordinator for the company's marketing team. Remodel Health is a software benefits company working on innovation in the field of employer health benefits. Those in the house now Bender for his efforts as the Social Chair and his continued efforts for the social committee.

Solomon Davis, a Religion major and Education minor, was placed with NEXT Studios, a self-described community of experienced entrepreneurs who help visionaries gain financing and capital. Solomon will officially fill the role of strategic relationships manager. Solomon should also be recognized for his efforts with the social committee.

Gerard Seig, a Financial Economics major and Religion and Asian Studies double minor will work for EM Brands, a company specializing in -----. Undergrad Brothers Contribute to College's Athletic Success

In addition to excelling in the classroom this semester, FJJs helped Wabash excel on the track, field, and in the pool this last semester.

Earlier this month at the Horace Grant Invitational, Brother Drake Hayes '24, managed to win the Men's 3000 Meter Run with a dominant performance and earned NCAC Athlete of the Week honors.

Most notably this past semester, Brothers Abe Wade '22, Thomas Joven '24, Brett Driscoll '24, Clay McPeek '24, and Noah Ridgeway '25 helped lead the Wabash football team to a 9-3 record and a recapturing of the Monon Bell. Brother McPeek in particular could be seen as a stalwart of the defense that allowed the offense to surmount a 21-point deficit.

On the soccer field, Brother Solomon Davis '22 provided a late 65th-minute goal to put Wabash ahead 2-1 over DePauw and continue Wabash's fall sports dominance over them.

Finally, in the pool Brothers Tanner Carver '23, Gavin Hill '24, Brandon Edwards '24, and Will Morris '25 helped Wabash soundly defeat DePauw 187-107 and complete the Fall sweep on DePauw.

On a more minor level, the chapter hopes to paint the walls on the residential floors of the house and talks for the renovation of the Brother Entertainment Room (BER) continue.
